TASK	DESCRIPTION	WHO IS RESPONSIBLE?
Disaster Kit	Periodically check stock. Take if evacuation is necessary. Include items you might want to take to an evacuation shelter. Remember to include medications and eye glasses.	
Keep Informed	Maintain access to NOAA or local radio, TV, email or text alerts for important and current information about disasters	
Family Medical & Pet Information	Take all household medical info. Evacuate pet(s), keep a phone list of pet-friendly motels and animal shelters, and assemble and take the pet disaster kit.	
Financial Information	Get copies of bank statements and cash in the event credit cards/ATMs don't work due to power outages. Bring copies of utility bills as proof of residence in applying for assistance.	
Sharing & Maintaining Plan	Share the completed plan with those who need to know. Meet with household members every 6 months or as needs change to update household plan.
